

BIRD INTAKE INFO

Q I found an injured bird! What should I do?

1 Catch & Contain

Please catch and contain the bird. If you need help, ask a neighbour, friend, community group, etc. We are not able to do call-outs at this stage.

2 Do NOT feed birdie

No water, no food! We repeat - do NOT feed any food or give any water to birdie, UNLESS instructed to by Tweet Tweet

3 Keep birdie warm

Heat will buy time: warm water bottle/bean bag is great! Birdie must be warmer than your face.

-DIY Rice-Bean Bag You can also heat 1cup of rice in a kitchen towel for 1min in the microwave, then fold in shape of a bean bag.

-DIY Warm water bottle Any empty cooldrink bottle or surgical glove filled with warm TAP water. Temperature should be the same as giving to an infant to hold (not too hot!)

4 Send us a photo, address & name

Take a clear picture of birdie. Go to the smallest room eg. toilet to take picture in case bird escape. Send us the photo + address where birdie was found + your full name please. Cape Nature requires us to keep a bird register, this is important part of nature conservation.

5 Receive intake code

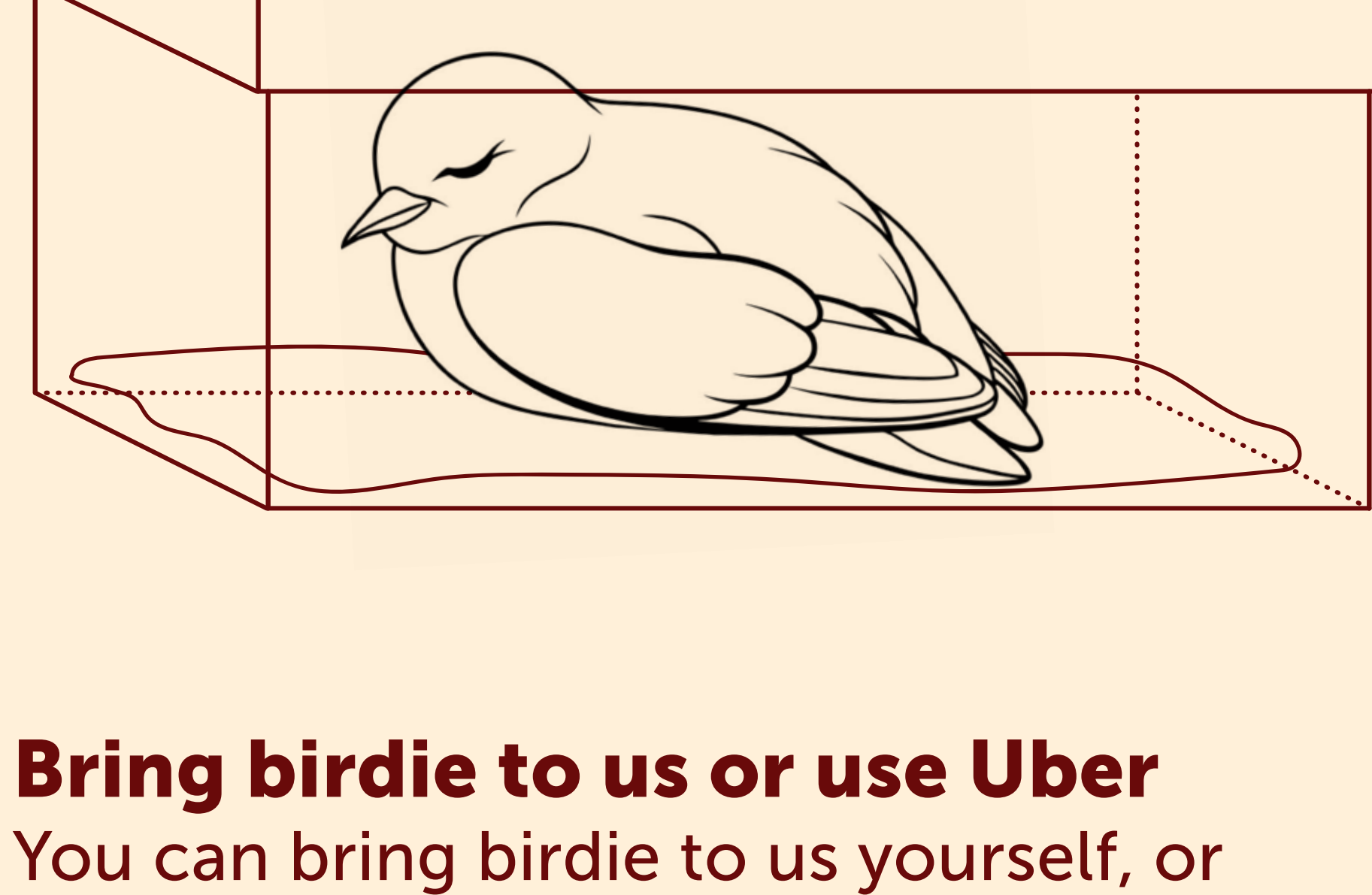
We will send an approval code if we can intake birdie. We truly try our best to help as many birds as possible, however if we cannot take birdie, please see contact info below for alternative options.

6 Confirm drop-off time

Please share estimated time of arrival for drop-off and confirm your ETA suits us. Do NOT just show up.

7 Place birdie in closed box for travel

Place birdie in a closed box with two or three small air holes in the lid of the box. Do NOT place birdie in an open box. You can add a soft cloth at the bottom of the box for birdie to sit/lie on.



8 Bring birdie to us or use Uber

You can bring birdie to us yourself, or alternatively use Uber to send birdie - we've have many birds delivered this way. If you do Uber birdie, write our address and phone nr on the box and send us a screenshot of the Uber driver and ETA.

9 Swift birdie intake. Ring doorbell once.

Birdie intake is a swift process:

- Please understand we don't have the luxury to make conversation.
- We will meet you at the front door
- No visitors allowed inside
- No public toilets available
